Dataplace - Accredited Data User application form update

The Accredited Data User application form in Dataplace has been updated to streamline submissions. Users can now download, complete, and upload their pre-filled application directly through the portal.

Key improvements include:

- Simplified application process requiring only an enquiry email, authorised officer details, contact officer information, and manual upload of the completed accreditation document via the right-hand upload section.
- Increased upload size limit from 20MB to 60MB.
- Added support for uploading PowerPoint (.ppt and .pptx) files.

The Accredited Data Service Provider application has been updated to improve user experience by aligning its interface with the Accredited Data User application.

Key enhancements include:

- Relocation of the application form download panel to the right-hand side for better accessibility.

- Increased upload file size limit from 20MB to 60MB.
- Added support for uploading PowerPoint (.ppt and .pptx) files.

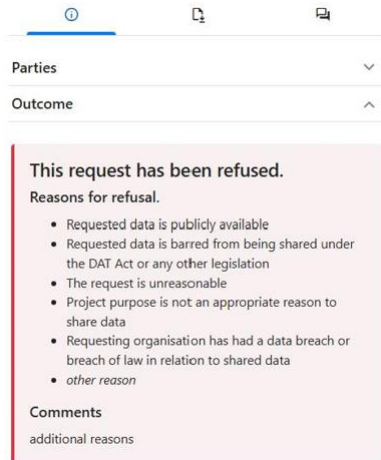

Dataplace - Enhance Chief Data Officer (CDO) visibility and self-serve functionality in Manage organisation.

To improve visibility of Chief Data Officers (CDOs) within organisations and enable self-service updates. The Manage Organisation section on Dataplace now supports the Organisation Administrator to add or update their CDO (or equivalent), either using a pick list or manual entry.

Dataplace - Accessibility enhancements to the

Accessibility improvements have been implemented on the Data Sharing Request (DSR) platform, following recent WCAG assessments.

Data Sharing Request user interface	<p>Key updates include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Enhanced Tooltips: Tooltips on the survey have been replaced with full descriptive text to ensure compatibility with keyboard navigation and screen readers, addressing previous accessibility barriers. • File Upload Accessibility: The file upload feature has been optimised for users utilising VoiceOver and other screen readers, enabling control access via keyboard navigation. • Improved Contrast: Form contrast has been increased to improve visibility and readability for all users.
Dataplace - Reasons for Refusal	<p>This update enhances transparency for all users with access to a DSR by displaying refusal reasons in the right-hand outcome panel. Dataplace - Data Sharing Agreement default view enhancement	<p>Enhancements have been made to the Data Sharing Request (DSR) page to display the agreement as the default view, ensuring users see the most current information upon access.</p> <p>Key Details include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • For DATA Scheme DSRs in pending registration and agreed status, the agreement now appears by default.

- For General data sharing agreements in an approved state, the agreement view is now the default.
- Users can easily switch back to the form view via the Request tab.
